Objective

To facilitate the access to potable water sources and sewerage systems through piloting of a new partnership model.

National level:

- **Ministry of Finance**
- **National Practical-Scientific Center of Preventive Medicine**

Objective

To facilitate the access to potable water sources and sewerage systems through piloting of a new partnership model.

Local level:

- **Local public administrations and different community actors**
- **Local Economic Agents**
- **Beneficiaries Associations and Coordination Committees**
- **Community groups, etc.**

Delegation of the responsibilities

- **Population involvement in decision taking process**
(focus groups, GM, RM, referenda)
 - **19%** of total adult population from the communities involved in decision taking process (focus groups, GM, RM, etc.):
 - about **5700** participants at GM
 - more than **7900** participants at referenda

Delegation of the responsibilities

- Contribution collection (mobilization of the population)
- Selection of design and construction companies (transparent organization of the competitions)
- Participatory monitoring of works' quality
- Sustainability assurance (BA, elaboration of the sustainability plans, etc.)

Capacity building

- about **1000** of trained persons
- **62** seminars
- more than **500** man/day

Implemented sub-projects

- **14** – planned
- **16** – implemented, inclusive
 - 11** – rural localities (2 in security area)
 - 5** – urban localities with population of up to 20 000 inhabitants

Study made - National Practical-Scientific
Center of Preventive Medicine.

Civil works implementation

- **26** artesian wells constructed or renovated
- **4** springs renovated
- **35** protection areas developed
- about **143 000 m** of water supply networks constructed
- More than **4600 m** of sewerage networks constructed
- **10** stations of residual water treatment installed
- in **5** localities the connection to the existing sewerage networks and treatment stations was made

Beneficiaries

- More than **70 000** beneficiaries – access to improved social services
- About **7300** new households connected
- About **27500** new beneficiaries, including 8674 children benefit of improved services
- **20** social infrastructure facilities (11 schools and 9 kindergartens) supplied with water, connected to sewerage networks and to residual water treatment stations

Sustainability assurance

- **11** Beneficiary Associations and **5** Coordination Committees were created
- **24** social infrastructure facilities were connected by communities
- More than **2 170 000 lei** (local and external sources) invested in extension of the sub-projects:
 - more than **28700 m** of potable water supply networks and
 - 410 m** of sewerage networks built additionally

Assimilation of financial sources

- **2 mln Euro** (equivalent of about 32 mln lei) offered to the RM by the EC (Food Security Program) to support the communities with stringent needs in potable water supply, construction of the sewerage systems and stations for residual water treatment
- about **6 000 000 lei** – contribution of the Government of the Republic of Moldova and beneficiaries communities
